Could handle be placed in a corner?
Be Careful Of Your Fingers	Emily Schindel	Definitely classifies as hot. Maybe try not to cut off the candles. Cut off more of hand instead. Pull back a bit to show more of cake. Grouping of three is nice. Good depth of field. The red object gives some nice contrast. Maybe use of a match might have been more impactful. Photographer: there was cloning on left side. How would you clone out the red object?
Burning Desire	Howard Ruston	Capture of fire is great. Logs are a bit dark. Could the logs be make lighter somehow? Some local editing on logs to lighten them. Photo goes really good with title. Photo has a lot of dimension to it. The flames have depth and allow the viewer to see multiple patterns (like a bird). The logs could be dodged a bit to bring them out more. Like the blue cast on logs. Like the composition Give the fire a bit more space to see tips of flames.
Caribbean Morning	Rob Arthur	Very nice picture. Like the blue/yellow complimenting colors. Something going on with horizon. Dips in middle, hump on right side. Composition draws eye into center of photo with Sun. Was color of clouds edited? Wonder what a long exposure would look like to smooth the water Photographer: this was an hdr from bracketed photos. Dragon Breath	Bob Holtsman	Nice one. Stunning shot. Makes you want to go the EX. Definitely hot. Good capture/timing to get this. Like the little particles below. Peak action captured. Face has good expression and detail. Nice framing. Love the black background. No distractions. Like the gradient in the flame. Like the red on his body, adds the idea of hot. Photographer: all the dots on bottom is alchol that didn't catch fire. The gradient is due to the temp
Fire And Fog	Brent Just	Interesting cropping square. What are white spots up top? Maybe reflections on glass. Could they be brushed out? Balance between flash fill and ambient. Like the timing between flames and coming out of fog. Fog has nice depth. Nice contrast between white and orange. Yellow ad on left draws eye away.
Fire Dancer	Ken Greenhorn	Flame coming out of head? She is hot. :). Flame from crotch? All in good fun. Says hot, but seems a bit busy maybe. Lose a bit of focus on subject. Maybe a slight different timing to get without the other dancer behind. Really difficult to get this kind of shot without it being busy. Hard to eliminate distractions. Maybe some dodging/burning to minimize distractions. Shoot lots to maybe get lucky with another frame without as many
Fire Jumper	Bob Holtsman	Like the leading line of fire to subject. Timing is good. Pylons and yellow a-frame could be removed to clean up the photo. Colors on subject reallmake him stand out. Multiple light sources as can be seen by multiple shadows of head. Photographer: 2 remote flashes in front. Could try rear curtain sync next time. Subject is Johnny Longsocks.
Good Night	Alysia Androsoff	Is this a composite? Why is the top candle placed there? Lighting is really well done for a candle light photo. Like the double exposure. More of an art photo. Maybe make the hand a bit more visible. Photographer: The only light is the candle on bottom. Only light on face is maybe from a porch light on driveway.
Heart Burn	Rae McLeod	Love the title. Like the subject pose with the fire stretching in front. Nice flow in photo. Would maybe like to see a bit more of flame on right side. Like the red light on skin. Works with topic. Like the stick at bottom with flame. Adds to the story. Hot spot on cheek. Photographer: like the way flames mimic his pose. The sheen on skin is from a coating used to protect skin. Taken in dominican republic. Skin reflects color temperture of
Here Comes The Sun	Howard Ruston	Maybe horizon not in middle. Some like the symmetry with horizon in middle. Horizon is straight. Nice color gradient. What would a polarizer do to this photo? Photographer: shot at NE swale at sunrise in spring.
Hot Air Rises	Rae McLeod	Like the warmth of photo. Feels like everybody is warm. Hot air balloon rides are highly recommended. The ambience and colors certainly fit topic. Photo tells a story. Where is the balloon? Photographer: Shot in arizona. There is a balloon above, just cropped out. Or maybe not. :)
Hot Coffee	Maurice Vold	Needs steam. Very nice composition. Like the directional light. Shadows give it depth. Love the setup. Maybe try it without the coffee bag. Nice color palette. Shape of bag is nice counterpoint to shape of cup but does take away a bit from photo story. Without the bag everything else is timeless. Red and blue are nice complimentary colors. Photographer: saw a similiar photo and tried to duplicate it.

Hot Cuppa Joe	Reg Coulter	There is the steam. Lift one hand a bit to make it more symmetrical. Interesting that it has cold colors but still fits the hot theme. Great photo. One of the favorites. Great capture. Mitts frame the cup nicely.
Hot Flashes	Brent Just	Like the framing with flames on both sides. Like the title. The green stands out to other warm colors. Like the flash about head. Nice edge lighting to separate subject from background.
Hot Licks	Steve Hiscock	Nice. Really, really like this image. Light mounts in background frame subject nicely. Mic in front gives nice sense of depth. The pose of player is great. Shows great emotion. Great shot. Wow. Maybe crop a bit off left to make flames symmetrical on each side.
Hot Pink	Barry Singer	Good interpretation of topic. Title makes it work. Enough DOF that everything is in focus. Petals almost mimic flames flickering. Shades give it depth. Maybe get the green dot perfectly centered. It is just slightly off. Like that the maker thought a bit outside the box for the topic. Lots of saturation without being over done. Lines and petals lead the eye to the center of flower. Stare at it and it becomes 3 dimensional. Great shot.
Hotness	Nathan Regamey	Beautiful. Well done. Nice color. Shame about flame from eye of girl in back. Maybe a square crop to remove a few background distractions. More impact if just the girls and flames. Like the smoke. Brave girls.
House Of Wax	Alysia Androsoff	Has some emotion in it. Very macabre. Nice catch light in eyes. Like the diagonal. Crop works. Brave model. Great concept. Photographer: candle is white but it drips blue wax.
Long Days Of Summer	Barry Singer	Like the sillouete of water from sprinklers. Lose the impact of water down low on ground. Still great photo. Interesting to get blues and oranges in sky. Very nice. Love the cloud formation. Could crop a little off the bottom to make it more panoramic.
My Hot Selfie	Richard Kerbes	The unbuttoned shirt really gives the hot vibe. Need a big gold chain. Interesting take on the topic. Like no reflection in glasses. Photographer: I was really hot.
Nearly Noon On Main Street	Eric Lawrenz	Not really getting hot out of a b&w image. Some can feel the heat. Wonder if some heat waves off the pavement could have been captured.
Pre Game Entrance	Steve Hiscock	Like the reflection of flames on ice. Great shot. Maybe crop out the half flame on left. Nice timing. Goalie not blocking any flames. Might be nicer with goalie entering flame instead of leaving.
Ritual	Ken Greenhorn	Awesome concept. Like that can't see the eyes. Fingers could be positioned better maybe. Candles slightly off balance from face. Photographer: totally candlelit
Saguaro Sentinel	Eric Lawrenz	We know it is the desert so it is hot. Too much cool tone to black & white. Don't get this unless it is hot an arrid. Feel like we are being given the filter. LOL. Little bit of emptiness on left. Line of clouds echos line of slope.
Soul Food	Gordon Sukut	Compose the potatos? A bit better. Looks like a spicy dish. Would like to see some boiling to show hot temp.
